

Suicide rates and the LGBTQ+ Community

- As many as 20% of, or 1 in 5, LGB adults have attempted suicide during their lifetimes*
- LGBTQ youth are more than four times as likely to attempt suicide than their peers**
- Suicide attempts among transgender people is almost 12% higher than the general population (7% v. 0.6%)***

Protective Factors



- Access to mental health care, and being proactive about mental health
- Feeling connected to family and community support
- Problem-solving and coping skills
- Limited access to lethal means
- Cultural and religious beliefs that encourage connecting and helpseeking, discourage suicidal behavior, or create a strong sense of purpose or self-esteem


What is Queer Theology?

 - Queer apologetics—a defense of queerness and our right to exist; grappling with questions of sin, morality, and queerness
 - Queer theology-how queer viewpoints and experiences shape our understanding of God and one another.
